




of the range of resource. You can put <u>adult</u> in your search entry too if you want to see mostly teen/adult resource on a topic.



This is the first place I search for free photos, illustrations, etc.



These images in my slides came from Pixabay. I included some tips not because Pixabay is hard. I picked these things up as I got more familiar with Pixabay's layout and contents.



I started by searching the Illustrations category for <u>free</u> <u>balance</u>. Then I switched to <u>stacked rocks transparent</u> and found this.

If you like a sketch look like this heart, include sketch in your search.



I put together separate images to create my Inner Mother card. I found the bird sketch when I search for <u>cherish</u>.



### Pixabay tips:

• Search results start with this iStock message and some images you would have to pay to use. Scroll down to see the royalty-free images. You can get a Pixabay membership and see more images, but I've always found something for free that will work for my needs.

- If you want the background of the image to be transparent (like the stack of rocks and the heart), include <u>transparent</u> in your search or at one of the high levels I think you can click a box to indicate you want transparent images in your search. Otherwise, you get a mix of both, which is not a problem as you're figuring out what you may want.
- There is an AI capability I haven't explored yet.
